Mr. Paul Smith, 72, of Newnan, passed away at his home Monday, October 4, 2021. He was born November 5, 1948, in Memphis, Tennessee, son of the late Donald Albert Smith and Martha Wardelle Wood Smith. Mr. Smith was a member of Crossroads Church in Sharpsburg, and was very active in church and discipleship ministries. He retired from the Federal Aviation Administration after 40 years, and also worked for Northrop Grumman. Paul never met a stranger and had many interests including spending time with family, boating, and fishing.

“ I would like to share the top three memories that came to mind when I learned Paul Smith had passed. In general, I remember Paul as a fellow FAA engineer and that we encouraged each other as such.

But number one memory beyond that was the time Paul invited my wife and I to a get together at his house. It soon became an unpleasant surprise as I learned it was for a business opportunity I had never heard of - Amway.

I decided right off that I did not want to join, and would not ever want to join, and Paul knew that. However, Paul and I had many conversations related to Amway after that. From those conversations, I began to understand the importance of motivation, as well as self-development and personal growth. For instance, Paul introduced me to Zig Zigler, among others.

The third memory was this past May, at my daughter Amanda's celebration of life. Paul came, and while we had maintained contact over the years, this was the first time in many years we had a face-to-face. We had a fantastic conversation, and it started with Paul mentioning the number two memory, and laughing about it as well – as he did every time we got together.

You see, back in 1983, before I moved to Spain, my wife and I invited Paul to come to church with us, and he did. Now, this was before Paul was a man of faith, before having a personal relationship with Christ. And that Sunday, the whole sermon was on the importance of tithing - giving back 10% to the church - and was the only time I have ever heard him preach on that.

When we left the church, Paul's first comment to us was - "I can't believe how they are always after our money." I did not respond at all - for several reasons: I did not believe the timing was right to share, or to try to convince Paul of anything. Also, sorry to say, I have never been a tithe warrior. But most important, I just did not feel it my place to make apologies for Dr. Charles Stanley.

Some of Paul's qualities that I admire include the fact that he was a caring man, and cared deeply for others. I found as an FAA manager that the quality I most sought in employees was that they cared. And, amazingly, those that most cared always turned out to be the best engineers.

I also appreciate that I never saw Paul angry, which often leads to hate. He was almost always with his great smile, and although I saw him disgusted a time or two, never angry. I believe that was a direct result of the fact Paul was all about love, which also produced respect and kindness for others. And then there was his boldness and bravery, to share his faith with others, even commit to the discipleship of others.

Those of you at the funeral will remember the video played with Sam in India talking about Paul. But what Sam said that really caught my attention was something most of you probably gave little thought to. Sam said, "I remember how he made me feel." Which aligns well with a 2020 life motto of mine (quoted by many)- some people will

remember what we say, more people will remember more of what we do, but even more will remember how we made them feel. Paul was not only a good man, he was a great man. And I admired him, to the point that is best reflected by what Jack Nicholson once said in a movie: "You make me want to be a better man."
