February 13, 1931 - November 18, 2018

On Sunday, November 18, 2018, Billy Jack Glazier, loving husband, father, grandfather, and brother passed away at the age of 87 surrounded by family in Peachtree City, Georgia.

Jack was born on February 13, 1931 in Wilkinson, West Virginia to Frank and Erna Glazier. He joined the United States Air Force in 1951 and served in the Korean War. On June 20, 1964 he married Kathleen Adeline Fox and enjoyed 51 years of marriage before Kathleen's passing. They raised two sons, Robert and Jeff.

He received his undergraduate degree from Marshall University in Huntington, West Virginia and his Masters of Education Degree from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. He worked for the Rochester, NY City School District for over 30 years rising to become the principal of John Marshall High School.
