He loved to show his dogs.

In 1998 he was going to enter the New York Westminster Dog Show. The show was the week my mother died, and instead he came to her funeral. That was the kind of man he was, always putting others ahead of himself.

His third passion was skeet shooting. He was a skeet champion well into his seventies. He had the eyes of an eagle and the steadiness of Clint Eastwood. He could out shoot guys half his age.

He was a rather serious fellow, but when he got to telling his pilot stories, like when the monkey got loose in the cargo hold, or when the new autopilot almost crashed the plane, or when the second man to walk on the moon, Buzz Aldrin, visited him in the cockpit, then his comical side ensued. He had a million stories, and could have made a fortune, if he had written a book.

Even though you are no longer here, I believe you are in a better place now, with Maxine, Barbara, and your dogs (dogs go to heaven too). Dale, the people who knew you, the millions that you touched when you flew, and your nephew Don, Thank You.

I apologize in not being able to attend the funeral. I have two dogs here, that need my attention, and one needs insulin. I think Dale

would understand.
