“ My mother, Annie Sara Camp Johnston, not only had Dot Steed Lassiter as a student at Campbell High School, in Fairburn, but they shared a lifelong deep friendship. Their mutual interest in family history, as well as the history of Campbell County and the Fairburn area, led to many conversations and research over the years. They often had lunch together at a variety of local restaurants, including Judy’s and McDonald’s. Mother couldn’t eat the McDonald’s hamburger buns with seeds on the top bun, so Dot would swap the bottom bun from her hamburger with the top bun from Mother’s. That was just a small example of Dot’s loving and generous nature.

Dot’s big smile, (or often a huge grin or cute giggle), was her trademark. No matter the occasion or situation, Dot could be seen with that sweet smile radiating from her face. Her face would also light up if she was talking about her beloved Jimmy, or her sweet Gary. Jimmy was a WWII veteran, which Dot was quick to proudly mention, and she always had a cute story to tell about her little boy, Gary. As many stories as Dot was able to share, she never had a negative word to say about anyone; if she thought about something negative, she would never give voice to that thought.

Many of my memories of Dot come from her service to others at Fairburn United Methodist Church. She was a Sunday School teacher to a large number of young people, whose lives were greatly enriched by having been a student of hers. I had the special privilege of teaching Sunday School alongside Dot for several years, along with playing the piano for her class. I, too, felt honored to be with Dot to bask in her special teaching and sharing her love in that area.

My other memories of Dot are related to her knowledge of, and her ability to remember, many facts about local families and the history of the area. Mother and Dot were among the founding members of the Old Campbell County Historical Society, where they both served as leaders for many years. Dot narrated a video history of Old Campbell County, which, at one time, was available on the OCCHS

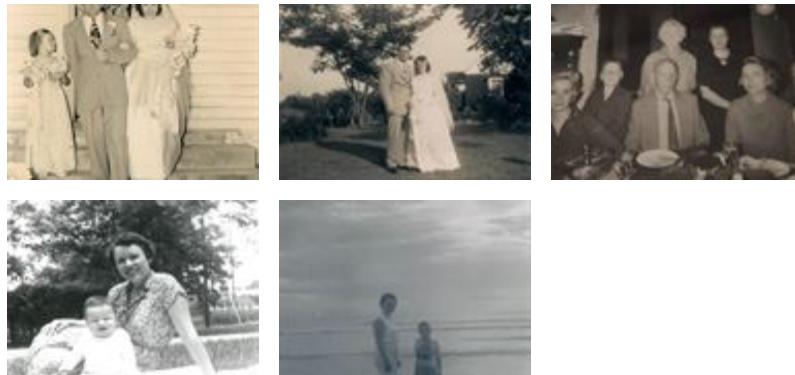

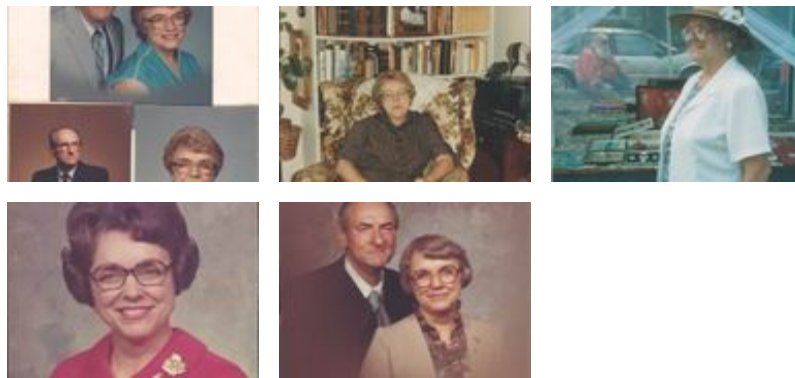
