



Mr. James Ray "Jim" Bennett

April 18, 1931 - February 7, 2023

James R. (Jim) Bennett, 91, of Peachtree City passed away on February 7, 2023, in Huntersville, NC, after a long battle with Parkinson's.

Jim was born on April 18, 1931, in Kannapolis, NC to Ernest and Enola Carriker Bennett. He was preceded in death by his parents, his sister, Ernestine Earnhardt, and his brother, Bill Bennett.

He is survived by his wife of 44 years, Janet Weed Bennett; daughters, Donna Bennett, Teri Bennett, and Lori (Ray) Renshaw; grandchildren, Ryan, Nicole, and Josh Renshaw; brother, Lewis Bennett; sister, Mildred Whittington; sister-in-law, Doris Bennett; and many nieces and nephews.

During his youth Jim excelled in all sports and upon graduation from high school in 1950 he attended Western Carolina University on an athletic scholarship. He left school after one year to join the Air Force during the Korean War. He received training as an Air Traffic Controller and was stationed at Fairford in England.

Jim was employed with the Federal Aviation Administration as an Air Traffic Controller and retired after 32 years with the last 22 years at Atlanta Hartsfield.

After retiring, Jim discovered his love of golf and his ability to play well. When he was 83 years old, there was a wonderful article about him in the Fayette newspaper dated February 18, 2015. He had many golf buddies over the years and he enjoyed "teeing it up" with all of them.

Jim was a people person and he was loved by everyone; he will be greatly

missed.
