Mr. Larry R. Mashburn of Tyrone passed away Tuesday, September 4, 2012. He was born in Lawrenceburg, TN on May 16, 1946 to the late James Travis and Gladys Thomason Mashburn. Larry served in the U.S. Navy as an air dale during the Vietnam era. He serviced VP-47 squadron aircraft as an aviation metal smith (for P3 Orions) in the Philippines, Vietnam, and Okinawa.
