



## Lynn Tierney

September 18, 1946 - October 20, 2018

Mrs. Lynn H. Tierney of Fairburn passed from this life on October 20, 2018. She is survived by her husband Lawrence “Mickey” Tierney of Fairburn, her two children from a previous marriage, Thomas Humber and Kathryn Loftin, three step-children, Bruce Tierney, Emily Bieger, and Patrick Tierney, an adopted son Cameron Barham, and 10 grandchildren.

Lynn was a 1967 Nursing School graduate of the Hospital of the University of Pennsylvania (HUP) in Philadelphia, PA, and spent many years working as a Registered Nurse (R.N.) at various hospitals in the Atlanta area. Her two favorite types of nursing involved caring for premature babies in Neonatal Intensive Care Units (NICU) and work in surgical settings as an operating room (OR) nurse. After her retirement, Lynn spent time with her family and travelling. Lynn was active for many years in local community theater with the Southside Theater Guild (STG) in Fairburn. Her participation spanned many decades beginning with the second production ever staged by the STG: Pinocchio. An avid dog lover, Lynn helped train seeing-eye/service dogs as puppies to help prepare them for eventual service work.

Funeral services for Lynn will be held at Parrott Funeral Home, 8355 Senoia Rd, Fairburn, GA, on October 27, 2018. Visitation from 9:00-10:00 a.m. A Memorial Service will be held at 10:00 a.m. Please do not send flowers. 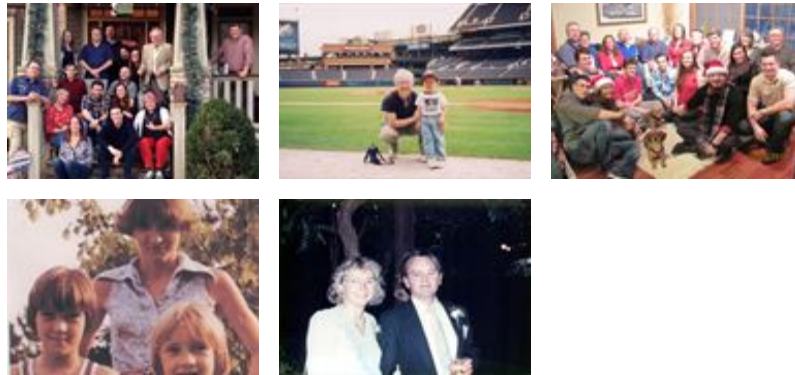
