“ I first met Marty in early 1987 I believe it was, when I started playing with a cat named Skip who had a studio at his home. Marty lived on the property and was also a musician, so we made a lot of music in this ultra-cool studio which was more like a commercial studio than any home studio, with air-gapped walls.

We all had so many things in common, from music, to computers, to electronics, to ham radio, to a love of being silly and having fun.

I was new to Los Angeles and Marty helped me get established there by hiring me part time at Dawson Technical Services, a business where he repaired TVs, stereos, amplifiers, and other electronics. I was a handy guy, but Marty taught me how to diagnose and repair circuit level components. Improved my soldering and desoldering skills considerably.

These are skills I have used throughout my own career to make a living!

He gave me a Fluke 77 meter to use, and I still have it, and it still works!

He put me to work repairing AWAI duplicating cassette decks that came from a studio that was tracking modern popular songs and putting foreign vocals to it. In addition to repairing all these decks, he was tracking guitar for them, and that led to me doing some bass work.

Marty also found I was an adept sound tech and introduced me to a couple sound companies that used me for FOH and monitor mix gigs for some up-and-coming acts.

Moving to a new area is difficult, especially a country boy moving to SoCal. Marty made that transition easier.

We've kept in touch over the years, with him stopping in to see me in Greenville SC on many trips he made for his job.

The last time I saw him was in 2019 when his wife, Carola, and him

*stopped in and we shared a long lunch catching up.
He even moved to within 3 hours of me, but in spite of that we never
got the chance to make music beyond the 80s and early 90s, the
one regret I have!*

*Recently, we have mostly chatted online, shared stupid memes and
laughs together, and every once in a while, we would test the
conditions of our rigs.*

*Marty, you were a great guy, and I shall always remember you and
all the help you gave me over the years. You you inspired me to
create a Facebook group with 13k members, where we try to help
local musicians get plugged into the music scene....*

*BTW, I'm not sad for Marty! I'm glad he got to meet a wonderful
woman that made him happy, move to a beautiful area of our
country and enjoy a lot of living!!!!
I'm just selfishly sad for me.*

A week ago tomorrow, Marty emailed some health concerns we have in common which included news of upcoming tests scheduled the next day.

An expected post-visit update never arrived.

Twice since, with building concern, email requests were sent seeking hopeful news.

No response.

Our weekend on-air gatherings concluded a short while ago with no Check-in from Marty so, on a whim, I did an internet search and remain stunned, truly frozen in place, to read our beloved Marty, had passed.

Carola, and to Marty's four-legged son, dog Master Bailey, we mourn Marty's passing and your loss with shared, tear-soaked cheeks.

How fortunate you were to have celebrated Marty's life - a person I affectionately called a "mystery man" given his many talents.

There are only a few people I have known earning the label of a "polymath" - Marty was a fine example.

We were born nearly a month apart in 1958 which afforded an

untold number of stories about our growing up years and adulthood - music, the advent of computers, ham radio and so many other shared topics.

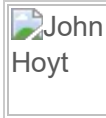
Godspeed Marty...drop some bread crumbs along your way to Heaven's Hooterville...we will be together again shortly.
