



Marvin Wilbur Tarpley

December 22, 1920 - December 9, 2015

Marvin Wilbur Tarpley (Tarp) of Aiken, SC died at 94 years of age on December 9, 2015 at Aiken Regional Medical Centers. He was born on December 22, 1920 in Fife, GA to Fannie Edmondson Tarpley and Zachary Clifford Tarpley. Tarp graduated from Campbell County (now South Fulton) High School in Fairburn, GA and attended Emory at Oxford College. Prior to WWII, Tarp studied aircraft radar installation and repair in the Civil Service at Fort Monmouth, NJ. He was a WWII veteran, having served with the Army Air Corps in the South Pacific, specifically on the island of Tinian. He was a broadcast engineer at WCCP radio station in Savannah, GA where he met his wife-to-be. He was chief engineer at WBBQ radio station in Augusta, GA. For 30 years, Tarp made numerous significant technical contributions to the operations at the DOE Savannah River Site. Having played for 90 years, Tarp was an accomplished musician on the piano and organ. Throughout his life, Tarp has volunteered through the churches and professional organizations that he has been affiliated with. Tarp's final years were spent enjoying playing the piano daily and for social gatherings, studying college level video courses, reading and hanging out with his family, dog and cat. Tarp is survived by his son, James Marvin Tarpley and James' wife Debbie and by his sisters Gladys Almyra Tarpley and Mary Lynn Tarpley Gillette. Tarp is predeceased by his wife of over sixty five years, Mary Elizabeth Brown Tarpley, his brother, Judson Leroy Tarpley and sister, Elizabeth Anne Tarpley. Graveside service and interment will be conducted at Bethany United Methodist Church Cemetery,

Fayetteville, GA on Sunday, December 13, 2015 at 2:00 PM. Arrangements have been entrusted to Parrott Funeral Home & Crematory of Fairburn, GA.
