I was a 23 year old kid in November of 2001 when I was entrusted to run the Chick fil A at West Shore Plaza in Tampa, Florida as the interim manager. Some of my friends in the Birmingham market knew Mike and told me how incredible he was as both a business consultant and a friend.

He visited my location a few times during my 5 months there and was supportive and helpful and was genuinely interested in helping me to succeed. When he called me in February of 2002 to let me know I was going to be offered the role of Operator at the store, I was disappointed to tell him that I had decided it wasn't for me.
