



Oma Wood

October 24, 1927 - August 13, 2025

Mrs. Oma Carolyn Wood ("Nanny" to her grandchildren and many others) stepped up into the eternal presence of Christ her Savior on Wednesday afternoon, August 13, 2025.

Born into the Camp family in Douglasville, Georgia in October, 1927, Oma was the second-youngest of ten children who grew up working on a small farm. In 1944 she met and married Army veteran John Barnett "Bob" Wood of Hogansville. They soon started a family and moved to Fairburn where she became a fixture of her neighborhood, a faithful member of her church (First Baptist of Fairburn), and the rock-solid center of her family's life for the next several generations.

Oma was preceded in death by her husband, Bob Wood; her parents, William Arthur Camp Sr. and Lillian Pearl Nibblet Camp; and her nine siblings (from youngest to oldest) Marie "Ree" Webb, Evelyn "Ebby" Jackson, William "Billy" Camp Jr., John "Hugh" Camp, Glennie Rae Shadix, Linnie Mae Milam, Hazel Vaughn, Eddie "Henley" Camp, and Verrell Shadix.

She is survived by her daughter, Carolyn W. Gammill; her son Gary D. Wood (Kathy); her grandchildren Don Gammill Jr. (Rebecca), Jonathan Wood, Emily Marziliano (Jonathan); and her great-grandchildren (who were especially close to her heart), Clara Gammill, Harper Marziliano, and Henley Marziliano.

With her welcoming smile and her warm, inviting demeanor, Mrs. Oma Wood actively demonstrated the unconditional love of Jesus to everyone she met, be it through her frequent phone calls, her exceptional cooking, or her service to others in countless different ways. She faced the reality of aging with optimism, confidence, and grace, and a week before her passing, she instructed, "Make sure to tell everybody that I love them very, very much." She certainly did.

The funeral service, which will be officiated by Rev. Dr. Oscar Cope and Rev. Evan Hill, will be held in the chapel at Parrott Funeral Home in Fairburn, Georgia on Monday, August 18 at 2:00 p.m. with viewing/visitation just before the service at 1:00 p.m. A graveside service and interment at Holly Hill Memorial Park Cemetery in Fairburn will directly follow.
