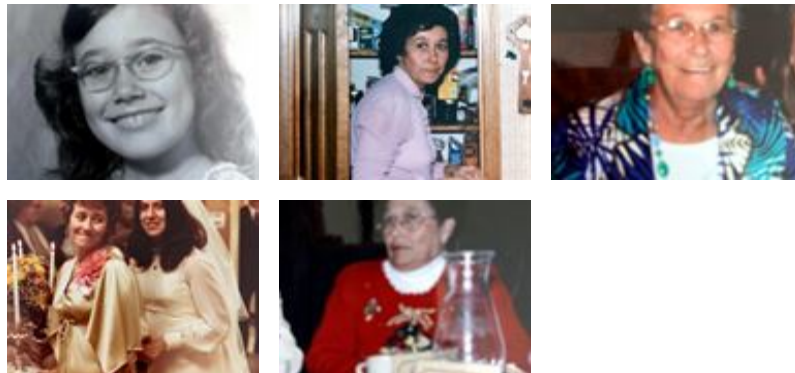

Peggy was a WONDERFUL cook! She baked and brought into work, the most delicious treats, and covered dishes for the MANY office parties we were known for having in our department. I was always asking her for her recipes. (I think we all did.) And she always shared. Soooo, another birthday rolled around, and she printed out on individual cards, 400 or so of her favorite recipes, and gave them to me in a very special wooden box! I’m not sure which

better represented her “labor of love” she had to tackle: typing up and printing out all all those cards? Or shopping all over Atlanta for the right size box to house the cards she had printed out! She enclosed a hysterically funny 1 page detailed list of her working on this project month by month, which I treasure as much as I do the recipes. My family knows, if there is ever a house fire, we are to grab: the computer password book; the large oil painting of my daughter; and Peggy’s box of recipes! If there is a kitchen in Heaven, I’m sure there will be a wonderful table prepared with everyone’s favorite “Peggy” treat ready we get there! Meanwhile, I will be making some of her recipes this week.

To know Peggy is to love Peggy. There are many more stories of Peggy quietly but thoughtfully going about just being a genuine, and kind loving person to all she knew. In 10 years of working together, you come away knowing a lot about one another. Time stands still for no one. Kenneth, you and she weren’t able to come out the last time we all got together right before Covid came through, and then the world shut down. I regret I didn’t make good on my promise to get out to see her again in person. Kenneth, you and Peggy were quite a team, an inspiration to many. 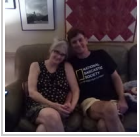
