



Robert Lawson Scruggs

February 5, 1921 - September 28, 2019

Robert Lawson (Bob) Scruggs, Sr. passed in peace September 28, 2019, at the age of 98. He was born February 5, 1921, in Atlanta, Georgia, spending most of his adult life in College Park, East Point, and Peachtree City. He was preceded in death by his parents Martha (Hope) and Charles C. Scruggs, Sr., brother Charles C. Scruggs, Jr., and son Robert L. (Bob) Scruggs, Jr. He is survived by his wife, Brenda Hazelwood-Scruggs, two sons, Carlton (Darline) Scruggs and Rick (Deanie) Scruggs, daughter-in-law Bonnie Scruggs, two step children, Leigh Anne (Bart) Lundy and Russ Hazelwood, five grandchildren, Stacye (Stefan) Scruggs-Bock, Cathy (Eric) Vitosh, Jennifer (Guy) Picketts, Matthew Scruggs and Emily (Brady) Ellsworth, and twelve great grandchildren.

Robert, who was beloved by many, lived a full and successful life. He had a passion for flying and sports, especially baseball. After graduating from North Fulton High School and North Georgia College, where he played baseball, basketball and trumpet in the band, he enrolled at Georgia Tech, but his love for flying drew him in another direction. During World War II, Robert served his country in the Army Air Corp. In 1946, he became a pilot with Delta Airlines and retired in 1981 after 35 years of flying. His name is synonymous with Post 50 American Legion Baseball, having coached them for 25 years with an unprecedented winning record. He was a longtime member of the Canongate Clubs (now Club.Corp) and played golf with The Fryer Group, regularly shooting his age. Bob had many other interests over the years. He was an

avid sailor, played the banjo, tennis, and owned 2 businesses, including Southern Maid Donut Shop in East Point. He was also a realtor and builder. Among the many apartments and homes, he built in the metropolitan Atlanta area, was the first talking house in Atlanta. After retiring from Delta Airlines, he was a scout for the Atlanta Braves Baseball Club.

He was a member of Heritage Christian Church and The Primetimers in Fayetteville. His funeral service will be held at Heritage Christian Church on Saturday, October 5 with Brother Danny Haynes (former Post 50 player) officiating. Visitation/Viewing at the church will be from 11:00 – 12:00 followed by a Memorial Service at 12:00 noon. A reception will be held in the Church Café afterwards.

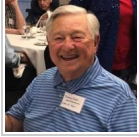

“ When Mr Scruggs called you an offered that invite to REPRESENT Post 50-you knew you had made it. The "JACKET." You walk into a place with that "JACKET" on-everybody knew you were special. Better than any trophy you could ever win, it was our "badge of honor." Anyone who wore it will say the same. The three years I played for Bob-1st year he just pulled me up and gave me a uni to ensure I'd play for him the next 2 years. We go down to Tampa - St. Pete where I met the great Lancer, Chuck Fowlke for the first time in a hotel room. We're up on Puerto Rico 4-0 after a Joe Monroe gran slam in the first. Our stud, Brad Campbell, who was as dominant as anyone I had ever seen gets to take the mound with a 4 run lead. He don't make it out of the 1st inning. Bob tells me to go warm up. I had NO idea I'd play til the following season-he just got me a week earlier. I thought he just wanted to see me throw a little in the pen. After a couple more line shots in the gap and now down 6-4 with only ONE out, he goes to the mound, looks my way and raises his arm in the air looking at me. I was just a kid!!! I asked the catcher what he was doing? He said "you're in the game kid." I go in throwing maybe 86 mph sidearm after Campbell was getting lit up throwing 92. I finished the game and we lost 6-4. An education I'll never forget. I knew I could play with the big boys All thanks to MR. SCRUGGS! I loved his class and the way he carried himself. One other story-I heard Mike Ivey's dad told Bob Mike would bat 4th. Mr. Scruggs said he didn't know yet where he'd hit. Mr Ivey said well, we'll just go somewhere else. Bob just said good luck and that was the end of that! Mike walked away, stopped then went back and told Mr. Scruggs he'd stay. He had so much talent, he didn't need 1-2 players. TEAM is what he preached.
