We both visited her house when she was designing a swimming pool for her grandchildren, and believe you me, she adored her grandchildren!

Jane, my wife, worked with Shirlee at the United States Army Reserve Command since 2011. No day passed that Shirlee and Jane did not leave the fort and go to lunch together, whether it was for a sandwich or a full pledge meal. They both sat in the Cadillac and their mouths ran. In fact, Jane was probably the last person to talk to Shirlee on the phone about three days before she passed. Jane called her and talked about a minute and then Shirlee said she had to go to the restroom. She never came back to the phone.

One memory I have is Jane and Shirlee’s conversation about cooking. Well, lo and behold one day the USP truck pulled up to our house and Shirlee had bought and sent up a state of the art pressure cooker that we still use. Jane gave Shirlee a 1-year subscription to the Georgia Farmers magazine because Shirlee loved the recipes that came out weekly, along with the pick your own vegetables listing.
