Victor Edward Bernholtz, III, 62, passed away at his home in Sharpsburg, Georgia surrounded by family the morning of Tuesday, October 23, 2018 after a courageous fight with cancer. Born April 25, 1956 in Sioux City, Iowa, he was the son of the late Victor E. Bernholtz, Jr. and Ida Mae (Walter) Bernholtz. Victor began his 40 plus years in the telecommunication industry in Des Moines, Iowa. He worked his way up from a pay phone coin collector with Northwestern Bell, to management positions with AT&T, Lucent Technologies and eventually taking early retirement from Avaya in 2002.
