This was a good life; they got to work outside in the fresh air and sunshine with their dad while their mother would prepare the most delicious meals which they would wolf down at lunch time and then it was back to work until the sun went down. The next day would find this routine repeated.

His parents were of the Baptist faith and attended a small church in Sand Valley, as did he. Will had many fond memories of those days; his friends and teachers were so dear to him.

After graduation from high school, he tried college for a while and that did not out well, so he later applied for entrance into the U.S. Air Force and was accepted into and trained as an aircraft mechanic and was stationed at Travis Air Force Base in northern California.
